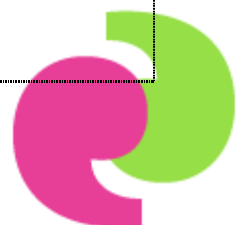

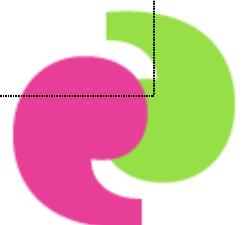

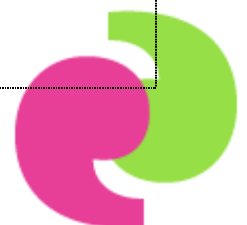

- The 5 CCGs are all moving in line with national policy.
- They are going through the process of planning and ensuring the Transformation Program is clinically safe and appropriate.
- The aim is to ensure there are good Kingston mental health services at primary care level. At Surbiton Health Centre there is a specialist mental health GP- any GP can contact him if they have a patient with mental health illness and they are not sure of which process to follow.
- It is desired that people have quick access to a quality mental health service- not to stay in secondary care but to be in primary care. The aim is to expand primary care services to accommodate this. A measure of success would be positive friends & family Test results.
- The Crisis Care Concordat has been developed - Sophie will circulate this to group members.
- Regarding mental health services for older people, it is desired that the services should look at physical health alongside mental health so there is parity of esteem. Generic services should skill up so that primary care especially can deliver mental health support
- There is a new Memory service at Surbiton Health centre
- The CCG has been given new funding to increase Parity Of Esteem (treating physical health the same as mental health)
- They have also been allocated around 1 million pounds to support primary care and third sector organisations
- There is planned to be six hundred million pounds extra funding nationally for the mental health services.
- All mental health commissioning intentions are on the CCG website
- The CCG has a very good relationship with the police service. They have reported that they mostly deal with issues relating to mental health and domestic abuse.
- There will now be police triage - A member of the Community Mental Health Team will go out with Police Officers to support a situation which arises.

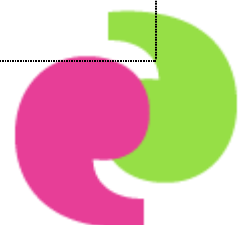

	<p><i>Comments from the group</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Various crisis points are turning people away, people are getting bounced around different services • It was raised by Simon that a person they have supported had needed mental health support, but had to wait months to be assessed, within the waiting time his mental health and physical wellbeing deteriorated greatly. There needs to be more responsive services to prevent this happening. • Healthwatch needs to work with the CCG to ensure there is a parallel process of working, so that people in the community are being engaged and have input into the commissioning of the mental health services. • Sylvie Ford said she would like to attend the meetings on a regular basis as it is very useful to hear the feedback and be able to communicate commissioning plans and updates on the services • The group is to visit the Kingston CCG website to look at the draft mental health commissioning intentions 	<p>ALL</p>

	<p>Discuss feedback received from other organisations in Kingston regarding emerging themes in MH discharge, plan next steps</p> <p><i>Comments on the discharge protocol (secondary to primary care) produced by SW London & St Georges MH Trust;</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If something goes wrong in the persons discharge process, what is the single point of access they need to contact? Is there an appeals and accountability process? • Sophie will send this question to the Trust and will circulate the response to the group • It was debated as to whether the discharge feed back collected should be raised at the Health Overview Panel, but as it is already a known that mental health discharge is very poor it was not agreed that this is the right course of action. • The group will monitor the discharge protocol when it comes in to force in February. • Sophie will continue to collect peoples experiences of discharge and report back to the group 	SB
