



1.	<p>Welcome and Apologies</p> <p>GG welcomed the Mental Health Task Group members. Apologies were received from Paul Summerton, Hestia and Ranjit Dhillon, Addiction Support Kingston</p>	
2.	<p>Notes and actions of the last meeting</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • SB to re organise dementia training with Alzheimer’s Society Kingston • In the previous meeting AM circulated a presentation by Dawn Chamberlain, Head of Operations at SWLStG Trust, regarding the Trust Transformation Programme. There was confusion over a table which showed what the Kingston Commissioners require for older peoples services. AM brought the document to the meeting and provided clarification from Dawn Chamberlain. The group was concerned that it appears that the commissioners in Kingston are not specifying a full model of community provision from SWLSTG Trust. SB will send the table to Sylvie Ford and request her to attend a meeting with the MH Task Group, as the group have questions and concerns over this. It was agreed to ask her for dates when she would be available to do so. <p>3.</p>	<p>Discussion on outcomes of Enter & View visit to Tolworth Hospital. Recommendations and proposals for a further visit</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The visits were a success. • Thanks were noted to SB in producing the reports and to AM, MCT, SI and TW for carrying out the visit and collecting the information. • SB will circulate the reports to all group members for sign off, they will then be sent to Jonathon Mason, Service Director to provide their response within 21 working days. • The Agenda of the next meeting needs to include a slot to plan next steps in responding to their action plan, and planning the next visit to check they are implementing improvements according to each recommendation • The Agenda should also include a discussion about the Jasmines Ward report, which was not yet completed at the time of this meeting. 	<p>SB</p>
	<p>Discuss HWK to link with other organisations to identify emerging themes regarding MH discharge</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • SF from SPEAR provided a case of a client who was discharged from hospital in Newcastle; she was referred to the CAB in Kingston. The lady was acutely ill, mental and physically and was recovering from abuse. She had attended Springfield Hospital, and was discharged without a plan. SPEAR stated this happens regularly with vulnerable people. <p>Homeless people also have a lot of trouble in trying to access GPs as they have no address, or no proof of address. It varies from GP to GP as to how helpful they are.</p> <p>SPEAR has a service agreement set up with Richmond Council; however they have not been able to establish this with Kingston Council. SF will report back as to why this is.</p>	<p>SF</p>



<p>5.</p>	<p>Any Other Business</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • SI reported a concern that 4 patients had been transferred from Mental Health Hospital inpatients to a local Travel lodge due to bed shortages. The patients were left with no money for food and had no support from health professionals. SI is completing a complaint with NHS service commissioners and will report back to the Group with any updates • SI reported that the consultancy firm C3 are developing a mental health discharge plan. Miles Rinaldi has said he is not aware of this. It has been found that C3 are communicating with the Community Mental Health Teams, whereas the SWLSTG protocol Miles Rinaldi is coordinating covers secondary to primary care discharge. This is a concern as there is no communication in the services. 	<p>SI</p>
