

<b>Meeting note: Community Care Task Group (CCTG)</b>

<p><b>1. Who attended? (name)</b></p> <p>Ann Macfarlane, CCTG Chair (AM) Sarah King (SK) Tulloch Kemp (TK) Nigel Spalding (NS)</p>
<p><b>2. What was discussed? (Headline bullet points)</b></p> <p>2.1 Everyone introduced themselves. Sarah King (SK) was welcomed to the group.</p> <p>2.2 The group went through the notes of the previous meeting. Item 3.4 states the wrong name and needs to be amended to Sian Brand.</p> <p>2.3 The group went through the actions of the previous meeting.</p> <p>2.4 AM reported that she hasn't been able to get the names of the people who were interested in the task group and were from Evolve, but recognised that Evolve will be involved in the new Learning Disabilities (LD) board, which was briefly explained.</p> <p>2.5 All other actions from the previous meeting were noted as completed.</p> <p>2.6 There was a discussion about the size of the task group, and why numbers may have dropped. It was recognised that the KCC Advisory Group members used to sit on the group. It was recognised that the KCC AG had been invited to attend this task group again following the closure of the KCC Advisory Group and that people who took part in the home care consultation with HWK had also been invited. Going forwards the group decided to think about how to better publicise the projects they will be involved in once they are more defined. More members may also come out of the work being done with people with LDs.</p> <p>2.7 An updated on KCC was given. The setup of the Wellbeing Teams with a single point of access, which were set up to address concerns around the delivery of homecare in Kingston, was explained. It was reported that this was being piloted. TK advised that he can send a KCC update document regularly to keep the group up to date.</p> <p>2.8 Connect Well, the local social prescribing initiative was explained and discussed. There are 3 tiers of support provided: self-referral, using digital tool with help of champions and via connectors. It was reported that Staywell are in the process of recruiting connectors who would help people use the tier 3 level of the Connect Well service. 6 community connectors have been recruited for the pilot.</p> <p>2.9 On 27 June there is a Connect Well meeting about digital tools testing from 12 to 1pm. It was suggested that as many task group members as can should go, with a view to understand how HWK and the TG can proceed in the project to be part of the design and evaluation of Connect Well. Regarding the research project it was explained that there were levels of evaluation to assess the</p>

impact on the individual, and the health and social care system (and possibly staff).
