
Where we are delivering the vaccine

Large Vaccination Centres




High volumes, high throughput in a fixed location for an extended period e.g. Hawks Road Clinic

How people are being contacted



The NHS will contact you directly when it is your turn



This may be via the phone, text message or letter from a GP practice



You may also receive a letter from the National Booking Service allowing you to book an appointment at a large vaccination centre





GP and community mobile teams beginning to contact and vaccinate housebound people in the priority groups. Those eligible being contacted in advance by phone or text or letter.


