

Access to general practice



Delivers:

- Increased routine GP & Nurse capacity to manage LTC's & frail elderly within primary care
- Increased capacity to provide appts. = reduced avoidable attendance at A&E for under 5 & 25-44 years old
- Increased weekend & eve capacity = reduced avoidable attendances at A&E by the 25-44 cohort
- Dedicated same day children's appts. = reduced avoidable 0-5 year old attendances at A&E
- Increased general practice capacity to manage routine appts. Including management of LTCs.

X no of appts available

- Those that can't access appts attend A&E, seek alternative help and/or go home
- Proposed model provides capacity to offer appts to 0-5's and 25-44 year olds
- Reduces avoidable attendance at A&E
- patients with LTCs combined with the lotter teams prevents crisis & NEL

5 Commissioning Areas

1) Access


- Access to primary care appointments
- Single point of access & triage

2) Outpatients

- 20% reduction in total OP referrals (this includes follow up and C2C)
- 11% reduction in number of GP initiated referrals to OP
- Reduction in the variation across practices in referral to OP
- 3) Non elective admissions
- Reduction in Non Elective Admissions supported by Locality Teams
- 4) Prevention
- 5) Mental Health



Single point of access: shares capacity & directs to appropriate services



Two enablers: EMIS & VOIP

EMIS: clinical records are shared across all practices, including primary care weekend hubs.

VOIP: provides the ability to connect all practice phones.



Risk Stratification

- KCCG has procured a new Risk Stratification tool called Sollis ACG tool
- This allows you to see a rolling 12 month history of patient's primary and secondary care activity as well as associated costs
- KCCG and Chambers will be able to view trends across practices
- All will be able to develop searches to identify cohorts and trends
- Each practice has been provided with 2 user accounts, 1 for a practice manager and 1 for a named GP
- A LCS has been created to support practices using the tool
- The Risk Stratification tool will be a key enabler to link patients from general practice to the locality multidisciplinary teams being established as part of Kingston Coordinated Care
- Using this tool will help you identify patients to be referred to be locality teams



Enablers

Kingston CCG has invested in a number of system enablers:

- Kinesis will support practices making decisions on out patient referrals
- DXS provides a systematic way of ensuring onward referral to the appropriate service & evidence based
- CCG provided practice level data enables practices to see if they are an outlier in any of the above areas
- Risk Stratification tool enables identification of patients at risk on a nonelective admission
- Introduction of social prescribing provides significant additional capacity to strengthen the preventative and proactive primary care work
