Communications report summary (January - March 2024)

We had **8323** visits to our website during this period, with **4092** individual 'unique' page views. This is slightly higher compared to the last Comms Report from the period **October - December 2023** which saw **9141** visits to our website during this period, with **3469** individual 'unique' page views.

Website performance

Pages most viewed on the website during this period were:
